But now to the news from Diani / Kenya:

The latest Information came by phone from Maria (she manages some of our money and lives in Kenya) 7 of our children have to go to school in January 2004. Considerations were made, private school, state school, own teacher ?? Questions about questions. The state schools have so far only insufficient teaching material, a chair for 3 children, etc. The private are too expensive and not always necessarily the "cream de la creme". A private teacher?

We are currently examining whether to hire a teacher to teach the children 2-3 years before going to secondary schools. It is still to be clarified whether this schooling would be recognized by the state and public schools.

Otherwise, the kids are healthy and the excursion to Bambolulu Park was a great success. Maybe Joshua ("Treasurer and Manager") will soon write us a few lines about it?

Maria also reported that through the kindergarten, the cohesion between the parents, the neighbors and the teacher Lucy has increased. You help each other more and forge plans for the future together. The plot around the kindergarten is embellished with flowers, all are neat and prudent.

With the Christmas gifts for the children, we are not much further (Christmas is also only in 1.5 weeks!). But that will work, because the gifts are to be bought locally, so they do not need to be sent.

As my husband and I are now planning to travel to Kenya, hopefully I can come up with a lot of positive news from there in the new year. On the spot you can clarify many things better and faster. Maybe there will be photos from the first day of school.

We will not be adding the donation list in the future. There have been more and more voices from Spen-dern who tend to discourage such a public list from donating. We do not want that at all. After all, however, a list will be kept of all donors and donations. And if necessary, everyone can see the income and expenses of our project. A detailed statement of the income and expenses will be published in the new year.

Still according to our motto from the first letter: Where, if not here? When, if not now? Who, if not us?

We can all be proud of what has been achieved so far.

All a blessed Christmas, a harmonious New Year, a healthy, successful and happy new year, and the KID "our" children in 2004, confidence and happiness and a chance.
